FOREWORD

DETERMINATION OF CLUB BOUNDARIES

IN THE SYDNEY METROPOLITAN AREA.

The determination of District Club Boundaries in the Sydney Metropolitan Area has been approached on the basis that it should form a sound foundation for the growth and strengthening of our code in Sydney.

In order to make the greatest use of the potential for growth which exists in every district it is essential that each District Club within the League follow certain guidelines for the growth of the code within its district.

The acceptance of such guidelines or principles by the League is of the utmost importance for the future of the code.

Without the adoption and implementation of such principles the determination of districts loses most of its value.

Consequently, to ensure that the maximum value can be achieved from the determination of District Club Boundaries certain principles and recommendations have been included in this report.

PRINCIPLES RELATED TO THE DETERMINATION

OF DISTRICT CLUB BOUNDARIES

In order to ensure that maximum growth and strengthening of the code in each district can be accomplished it is essential that the following principles be adopted.

1. Each District Club must have as its policy the responsibility for football within its District from the youngest to the oldest player.
2. Each District Club must have as its aim the ultimate introduction of the game into all schools and youth organisations within its District.
3. Each District Club should have its Committee to administer its junior and school activities and this Committee should have representation on the Management Committee of the Club.

It is essential that there be complete integration of senior and junior football within the District Club.

4. An ultimate type of District Club Composition is set out on Page 3.
5. Each District Club should implement a definite and methodical Plan for Growth of Junior Teams within its district.

One possible approach is set out in the attached "Plan for Growth of Junior Teams Based on Primary School Areas within the District."  
(Page 4)

6. Every junior player within the district should be given membership of the District Club to develop Club loyalty.
7. Members of the families from whence junior players come should be encouraged to become members of the District Club.
8. Maximum advantage should be taken by each District Club of the League's Coaching Clinics to increase the availability of coaches and to improve the standard of coaching.

In relation to the composition and the operations of the League the following principles should be adopted.

1. Each District Club should have equal representation on the Sydney League.

There should be no such thing as first division and second division districts.


2. No District Club should be permitted to have a Team in the 1st Division of the Senior Competition, or possibly even the 2nd Division, if it is not carrying out a Plan for Growth of Junior Teams in a satisfactory or proper manner.

3. Season Tickets for Adult admission to Senior games should be introduced, with District Clubs receiving commission according to the number of sales within the District.

An incentive to purchase season tickets could well be in the form of tickets etc. to the V.F.L. Grand Final for the holders of certain numbered season tickets.

Such ticket sales should be particularly directed towards the parents of junior players.

DETERMINATION OF CLUB BOUNDARIES

SYDNEY METROPOLITAN AREA

FACTORS WHICH HAVE BEEN CONSIDERED

In determining the most appropriate Club Boundaries within the Sydney Metropolitan Area five factors have been taken into account.

1. The population and population trends within each area.
2. The number of primary schools within each area.
3. The possibility of incorporating a full municipal area or a combination of complete municipal areas within the Club area.
4. The desirability that the physical area of each district should not be excessive or unmanageable in size and that it should form a logical geographical area.
5. The possibility of incorporating in present district boundaries any areas where it is considered that there is potential for future development of new district clubs.

1. Population Within Each Area

As a guide, the position has been considered in Melbourne, Adelaide and Perth.

If we were to plan on the basis of one District Club with a first grade team for each 100,000 population, with the population of Sydney being 3,000,000, the number of District Clubs in Sydney could be as high as 30.

However, rather than aim for 30 District Clubs in Sydney it would appear more logical to have a smaller number of District Clubs each providing a First Grade Senior Team of high standard.

It is proposed therefore, that each Club's District should contain:

- (a) a population which exceeds 100,000 at present,
- or (b) a population which is likely to exceed 100,000 within the next five to 10 years

The population levels in areas where reductions are taking place have generally been set much higher than areas where growth is occurring and is likely to continue, with the object of moving towards more equitable levels of population in all Clubs districts over the next few years.

2. Primary Schools Within Each District

To meet the requirements of a 1st and Reserve Grade Team in a District:-

Players required for 1st and Reserve Grade Team: Say 60.

Average playing career per player: Say from the age of 20 to the age of 29, i.e. 10 years.

Number of new players required each year  $\frac{60}{10} = 6$ .

---

To meet the requirements of six new players each year, it is assumed that one new player can be obtained each year from among each two or three Junior Teams which have originated from Primary School teams and which are based on Primary School areas within the District.

This requires between 12 and 18 Primary School based teams within each District Clubs area, or an average of 15 Primary School based teams per district.

To provide for this number of teams within each District the number of Primary School based teams within the area should be a minimum of 16, i.e. two competitions each of eight teams.

To enable this number of Primary School based teams to be developed the minimum number of Primary Schools available within the District has been taken as 20.

As Primary Schools are fairly representative of local areas within a District they should form the nucleus of local junior teams leading through ultimately to open age competitions within each particular district, as well as being a nursery for players for the District Senior Team.

As well as providing players for the future, every junior player means a potential Club supporter from the parents of the junior player.

It is by far the most effective way of increasing Club support.

3. Incorporation of Municipal Areas with Club Districts

As far as possible, each Club District includes one or more complete Municipalities to give

- (i) identification with the Municipal Council or Councils
- (ii) identification with the local community

In some cases, it has not been possible to work in terms of complete Municipalities due to the size of the population or the number of schools, which in some cases has been too small and in others too large.

---

4. Physical Area of a Club District

Efforts have been made to ensure that the area embraced by each Club District is the most logical in terms of

- (i) size, so that transport within the area is reasonable
  - (ii) geographical boundaries such as waterways, train lines, etc.
  - (iii) shopping centres, community centres, etc. to maximise publicity and general community interest.
- 

5. Incorporating in Present District Boundaries any Areas where it is considered that there is Potential for Future Development of New District Clubs.

It is considered that, at this stage, it would be desirable to form Junior Associations within those Districts classified as "Possibilities" to ensure continuity of football for boys playing in Primary School teams, with the object of ultimate establishment of Senior Teams in those Districts.

Such Junior Associations would be established and operate under the auspices of the N.S.W. Junior Football Council.

Under this plan there would be no extension of Club District Boundaries into adjoining Districts.
