## NEWCASTLE JUNIOR AFL 1995 REPORT

We will only call it a total success when all clubs have two junior teams playing regularly on a Saturday.

Arrivals of the finals have seen rejuvenated interest by the participating teams with what can only be described as some of the most fantastic games of junior football played in Newcastle for many years. All games have so far in the finals have shown a skill level much higher than in recent years. Our standard is certainly improving.

Much of the improvement in our players has been due to the opportunities for many of them to compete in representative games of the highest order. Our boys have played at Wagga, Sydney, the Central Coast, Perth and during the upcoming Grand Final week in Melbourne. Special mention to Damien Allen and Daniel Grant for winning NSW state schoolboy team selection. Our Auskick program is being run by several clubs for all interested five to eleven boys and girls. The U/11s played on the SCG during the Swans v Richmond game earlier this year and had a most enjoyable day. Has your club started the Auskick program yet?

With the appointment of Alan Waud from the Central Coast as the first development for the Hunter Region, we will see further improvements in the junior league. Alan has already made progress in the Newcastle Primary Schools and we wish him and our club representatives all the very best for the remainder of the year. The Hunter Region has requested from the NSW development board that this position be made a permanent appointment in 1996.

The grand finals today are the result of some great lead up preliminary games resulting in some surprising results. What a great game we have when the result of a game comes down to the team that plays best on the day. Good luck to all teams competing today. We know both games will be very close, play well boys, enjoy yourselves, and remember you are all winners just because you are playing today.

A final thank you to all coaches, the club delegates, and especially to the boy's parents for supporting our junior league. We still have along way to go and your continued support will help make our competition an enjoyable alternative sport for more boys in the years to come.
