LOCAL RULES

(1) 22 INTERCHANGEABLE PLAYERS

Twenty-two interchangeable players are permitted in all grades. They may be interchanged at any stage of the game.

Before commencement of the match, the central umpire should nominate to each coach, the control area. This control area should be a specific section of the boundary line, not greater than twenty (20) metres in length. The area, whenever possible, should be immediately in front of two (2) official timekeepers.

Whilst players may be interchanged at any stage during the game (or during any interval) if any players are interchanged during the actual playing time, the retiring player must be off before the new one goes on, and both "on" and "offs" must be made through the designated control area.

Should these interchanges not be effected to the umpire's satisfaction he may, at his discretion, restrict such changes to be only permitted at the set intervals.

(2) SEND-OFF RULE

Each umpire shall carry yellow and red cards during the game.

- (a) Yellow card indicates a player is being sent off for duration of one quarter of match time.
- (b) Red card indicates a player is being sent off for duration of the match.
- (c) Both card infringements are to be noted by umpires.
- (d) Umpires retain the power to report players.
- (e) Timekeeper records the send-off time when the order-off rule is invoked and authorises player's return to the field, if applicable.
- (f) Umpires are to inform timekeepers of their responsibilities before the game.

(3) UNDER 11 MODIFIED RULES

Rules governing Under 11 matches are as for other grades, except that:

- Umpires are to throw the ball up, rather than bounce it to commence play.
- When ball goes out of bounds, the nearest opposing player is awarded a free kick. The ball will only be thrown in where doubt exists as to which team had last touch.
- Under 11 coaches are permitted on the field during the course of the game, but only to advise players. However, should the spirit of this rule not be maintained, the umpire may disallow this privilege.
- No kicking the ball off the ground.
- Players are only allowed one bounce of the ball.
- No minimum distance is required for a player to mark the ball.

TEAM RESPONSIBILITIES

Team manager of each team must provide:

- (a) Goal umpire (with flags, score card and white coat)
- (b) Boundary umpire (correctly attired)
- (c) One football
- (d) Team sheets
- (e) Spare whistle
- (f) Red armband for Official Runner.
- (g) Timekeeper (and suitable sounding device)

FORFEITS

A forfeit may be claimed against any team unable to field the "minimum team" of 12 players within 15 minutes of the set starting time. (Note: There is no "minimum team" in Under 11 matches.)

If a team has at least 12 available players at the set starting time, it can **NOT** claim 15 minutes' grace under the rule above.

Forfeit details must be listed on the team sheet and submitted to the umpire.

WET WEATHER

Matches will be replayed if postponed due to bad weather. Decision for postponement will be made by opposing coaches, or in the case of disagreement, by the central umpire.

DURATION OF GAMES

Under 11 — 4 x 10-minute quarters
Under 13 — 4 x 15-minute quarters
Under 15 — 4 x 15-minute quarters
Under 17 — 4 x 20-minute quarters

FINALS INFORMATION

Semi-finals will be played on August 2, 1980.
Preliminary Final and Grand Final will be played on August 9 and August 16, 1980.
Match grounds, times and duration of quarters will be advised.

TEAM MANAGER'S DUTIES

Apart from looking after the team requirements, the manager is responsible for seeing the goal and boundary umpires are on hand, as well as a timekeeper. At the end of the game the manager hands the team sheet (with all players' names completed) to the umpire. After completion of all the forms, each team manager should pay the umpires' fee direct to the umpires, as per the following scale:

U 11	\$4.00 per team
U 13	\$5.00 per team
U 15	\$6.00 per team
U 17	\$7.50 per team

All completed team sheets are retained by the umpire for passing on to the Records Officer.

Managers should note that when a forfeit is not notified to the Association Secretary by the Friday prior to the scheduled match . . . umpire's fees must still be paid if the umpire attends.

At no time are managers, coaches or spectators allowed on the playing area — the only exceptions being serious injury, and the Under 11 coach.

GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING OF A PLAYER OR CLUB OFFICIAL

- (1) When an umpire elects to report a player or club official he should, at the close of the match, write a signed report on the back of both team sheets, giving details of the offence. The manager of each team is to sign the back of his team sheet to indicate that he has sighted the report and is properly informed of the charge.
- (2) When a report takes place the umpire retains one team sheet for presentation to the Tribunal meeting.
- (3) The umpire is to inform (no later than the Sunday following the match when the report was made) the Umpires Appointment Board Secretary, Jim Fyall (home telephone is 93-3598), that a report has been made.
- (4) The Umpires Secretary will inform the President of the Association, Warwick Davis—phone 449 2576 — who, in turn, will arrange for the Tribunal to meet at Forestville Hall at 7.00 p.m. on the Tuesday following the date of the report (any other venue arrangements will be notified to each interested party).

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
